Massey College New Senior Fellow Nomination and Selection Process

Approved by the Governing Board on May 9, 2018

The points below outline the process through which new Senior Fellows of Massey College are to be nominated and selected, as well as the starting date and length of term of new GB members.

1. All members of the Massey Community (including Junior Fellows, Senior Fellows, Quadranglers, Visiting Scholars, Journalism Fellows, Staff, and Alumni) are eligible to nominate new SFs for consideration
2. Each nominee must be supported by two nominators within the Massey Community, one of whom will serve as lead nominator.
3. Nominations are to include a nomination form, a cover letter from each nominator, and the candidate's CV.
4. Nominations will be sent to the Senior Fellow Nominating sub-committee of the GNC whose role is to select a slate of candidates to be submitted to GNC.
5. Nominees should meet some or all of the following criteria: high achievement in their chosen discipline for their stage of career, community engagement, engagement or experience with graduate students, and clear indications that they will actively participate in the life of the college as described in the document on [Role and Activities of Senior Fellows](#). In keeping with the College's commitment to principles of diversity, Senior Fellow selection will take account of demographics in order to build and maintain an inclusive community that expresses the diversities of the University of Toronto.
6. The persons on the proposed slate will be contacted by a representative of GNC with the question of whether the nominated person would like her/his name to stand on the ballot.
7. The final slate of candidates will be submitted for approval by the Governing Board.
8. The SF term begin on the date that the Governing Board approves the candidate's selection.
9. The initial term of a SF is to be three years, followed by possible renewals at each subsequent three-year mark.
